# How to Respond to Symptoms of COVID-19 (for children)

The main symptoms of Coronavirus are:

- High temperature
- New, continuous cough
- Loss of sense of smell or taste

## If a child is presenting any of the above symptoms ....

#### What MUST be done ....

- The child must be sent home and collected at the earliest opportunity.
- The child will be taken to the Surgery, where they will be supervised by the School Nurse or Matron whilst awaiting collection, using the separately designated and isolated room. Separate toilet facilities will also be available.
- PPE will be worn by the School Nurse caring for the child, if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained.
- Anyone in contact with the unwell child should wash their hands thoroughly afterwards. Domestic staff will clean the affected area once the child has left the premises.

## What does NOT need to be done ....

- The School does not need to send other children or staff home. We will await testing results for the suspected case.
- The School will not need to inform parents about a suspected case, unless the results are positive. Names of individuals will not be shared unless essential to protect others.

The School will advise parents to isolate their child for 14 days. The rest of the household (including siblings) need to isolate for 14 days. Parents must have their child tested for the virus.

### **Positive Result**

#### **Negative Result**

If the child tests negative, they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus, they can stop self-isolating. Other members of the household can stop self-isolating.

Other pupils and members of staff in contact with the symptomatic person can continue to stay in school, unless they display symptoms.
